## 110th CONGRESS SCORECARD (2007-2008)

The National Tax Limitation Committee (NTLC) was organized in 1975 to seek constitutional and other limits on taxes, spending and deficits at the federal, state and local levels of government. In keeping with this mission, NTLC analyzes the voting records of United States Senators and Representatives, as it has done for 24 years. This report on the 110<sup>th</sup> Congress covers the period from January 2007 through August 2008.

**Criteria for Congressional Ratings:** Each score is reflective of the individual's public position on key votes. Some 39 House and 40 Senate votes were used in the preparation of this scorecard. In selecting votes, NTLC placed special emphasis on tax, budget and appropriation measures that would have a major impact on long-term taxing and spending programs of the government. Also selected were votes that may have relatively small fiscal consequences in a particular year but nevertheless provide a good "litmus test" of the attitude or philosophy of the legislator with respect to government regulation, private property rights, federalism and the size of the federal government. Every action considered for this rating – floor votes on bills or amendments, votes on procedural motions, etc. – has been weighed and tallied to present an accurate "fiscal responsibility" score for each Member. The votes used in this scorecard are listed on the back cover.

The 110<sup>th</sup> Congress failed to extend the 2001 and 2003 tax cuts urged by the President and various Members, general taxpayer organizations, associations and individuals. Despite the necessity to increase spending on defense, intelligence and homeland security, domestic spending was not constrained. Both so-called mandatory and discretionary spending have grown rapidly. While deficits are to be abhorred, increased government spending is worse. It is the size of government that is the key barometer for NTLC., as our late mentor and co-founder of NTLC, Milton Friedman, underscored regularly. At approximately 35% of Gross Domestic Product (GDP), spending at all levels of government is far above the optimal level to assure maximum national economic growth.

During the 110<sup>th</sup> Congress, NTLC placed special emphasis on killing the federal death (estate) tax, as it has in the past, and on ending the 1993 income tax increase on Social Security benefits, terminating the Alternative Minimum Tax (AMT), preserving current tax rates on dividends and capital gains and reducing the corporate tax rate to 25% to keep the US competitive with nations around the globe. The liberal leadership of the 110<sup>th</sup> Congress resisted these efforts.

Votes were selected in the 110<sup>th</sup> Congress to emphasize those Members willing to cut spending and special-interest earmarks. Such votes provided a special opportunity to test a Member's commitment to fiscal discipline. A careful review of the voting records of the 30 House seats that changed party control in the November 2006 election was especially revealing. While the new, replacement Members represented themselves as moderate and independent, they voted virtually lockstep with the liberal leadership, many garnering "zero" and virtually all of them earning "F" grades on this 110<sup>th</sup> Congress scorecard.

**Voting Scores for Members of Congress in Percentage and Letter Grades:** Scores for Members of the House and Senate are expressed in percentages of all votes cast on those selected by NTLC. The Member may or may not have been present and voting on each and every roll call; the percentage reflects actual votes only. A Member was not penalized for missing up by three votes. (Presidential candidates missed many votes while on the campaign trail during 2007 and 2008. We did not penalize them but counted only the votes they actually cast to compute their scores.) A perfect score, one most favorable to the taxpayer, in our view, is 100%. The worst score is 0%. To convert percentages to letter grades, use the following schedule: 80-100% = A; 60-79% = B; 40-59% = C; 20-39% = D; under 19% = F. (Members in several districts died, resigned or otherwise left office during the 110<sup>th</sup> Congress; only the scores of their successors are set forth here.)

**How to Read the Scorecard:** Following the state name, the two United States Senators are listed first (in bold print), then the Representatives opposite their district numbers. The right-hand column lists the percentage scores.
